

## Highlights about the LFCC Fauquier Campus – Summer 2017

### *Enrollment*

- LFCC student headcount enrollment at FC was 1,860 in fall 2016 representing 27.1% of the LFCC total of 6,868.
- In the ten years since Fall 2006 when there were 1,376 students, FC has grown 35.2%. Middletown enrollment has grown 11.8% in during same time period.
- The FC served an estimated 996 full-time equivalent (FTE) students or 26.2% of the estimated LFCC total of 3,803 FTE.
- Approximately 26.1% of FC students were full-time, 58.3% are female, and 16.1% were first-time in college for the fall 2016 semester – with Middletown campus showing 28.9% full-time, 61.8% female and 17.5% first-time in college.
- Approximately 77.8% of FC students were White/Caucasian, 5.9% Black/African American, 9.1% Hispanic, 1.9% Asian, 0.4% Native American, and 0.2% Unknown/Other. This is in contrast to the Middletown campus, which had 3.5% Black/African American and 80.1% White/Caucasian.
- Approximately 52.3% of FC students were served on-campus, up slightly from 51.5% for Middletown. The off-campus enrollment of 887 includes 627 dual enrolled students.
- The 627 Dual enrolled (DE) students make up 26.2% of all DE enrollment. They represent 33.7% of the 1,860 total students at FC, comparable to Middletown where DE makes up 35.3%.
- The top three dual enrollment high schools in fall 2016 for FC were Kettle Run High School (205), Fauquier High School (182), and Liberty High School (87).
- Of the 1,233 FC students who are not in dual enrollment, 223 attended Liberty High School, 196 Fauquier High School, 113 Kettle Run High School, and 86 Culpepper High School.
- The jurisdictions for students served by FC include Fauquier County (1,181 or 63.5%), Culpeper County (231, 12.4%), Rappahannock County (102, 5.5%), Prince William County (83, 4.5%), Warren County (27, 1.5%), Winchester (24, 1.3%), Frederick (18, 1%), Clarke (17, 1%), Fairfax County (17, 1%), Shenandoah (16, .9%), Loudoun County (13, .7%), and Page County (11, .6%).
- The majority of FC students are working towards the AA&S & AS transfer degree (42.4%), followed by non-degree studies (39.7%) which includes DE, AAS (8.7%), certificates (7.5%), and career studies

certificates (1.8%).

- In terms of major programs of FC students, these include transfer programs in general studies including concentrations in human services, administration of justice and recreation/outdoor leadership (20.9%), science including concentrations in agriculture science, computer science, engineering, forensicscience and health professions (10.1%), business administration (4.5%), liberal arts including concentrations in communication and philosophy and fine arts (4.4%) and education (2.5%); as well as associate of applied science degree program in nursing(3.0%).

#### *Awards*

- A total of 368 of the estimated 1,706 LFCC awards in 2016-17 were to FC students (21.6%). The 368 awards include 148 AA&S and AS, 36 AAS, 158 certificates, and 26 career studies certificates. This represents a 180.9% increase over the 131 FC awards given in 2006-07.

#### *Courses*

- A total of 502 course sections were offered by the FC in fall 2016, including labs. These classes served 5,967 student seats.
- Approximately 192 sections (38.2%) of these involved online, compressed video, or hybrid delivery. The enrollment for these courses was 2,442 students or 40.9% of the total FC course enrollment.
- A total of 311 online class sections were offered over the spring 2016, summer 2016, and fall 2016 semesters serving 4,429 student seats.
- The largest online enrollments in fall 2016 were in HLT (188), ENG (175), BIO (168), CST (162), MTH (121), and PSY (112).
- Among all delivery modes, the highest enrollments in fall 2016 are ENG (730), BIO (696), HIS (598), MTH (449), MTE (288), SDV (280), PLS (252), CST (247), HLT (242), PSY (220), and ITE (218).

#### *FC Trends*

- LFCC increased noticeably (160.8%) between fall 1990 and fall 2016. However, service to Fauquier County students by both campuses has increased 902.5%, from 120 students in fall 1990 to 1,203 in fall 2016.
- According to SCHEV Residency Reports, 32.8% or 1,202 of all Fauquier County residents going to college in fall 2016 went to LFCC. Another 427 (11.6%) went to NVCC, 366 (10%) to George Mason, 259 (7.1%) to Virginia Tech, 183 (5.0%) to JMU, 142 (3.9%) to VCU, 123 (3.4%) to Liberty and 90 (2.5%) to Radford.
